Terms of Appointment

This is a permanent position.

We are currently operating a hybrid system, working set days in our London office near Old Street with some working from home.

Salary

The salary for this post is £36,000 per annum pro rata for a four day week, which equates to £28,800. Salary is paid into your account on the last working day of the month. The postholder will be automatically enrolled into the NEST pension scheme, with 3% employer contributions.

Working Hours

This position is four days/ week. Usual working hours are 9.30-5.30. Regular evening and weekend work will be required, as will some national and international travel. We operate a time off in lieu policy.

Annual Leave

There is an annual leave entitlement of 25 days per annum pro rata, in addition to statutory holidays.

Probation

The postholder will be subject to a three month probationary period.
